



Chiswick House and Gardens

Chiswick House and Gardens is England's first and one of the finest examples of neo-Palladian architecture set in a beautiful 65-acre estate in West London.

Considered to be the birthplace of the English landscape movement and a major environmental and recreational resource, Chiswick House and Gardens receive over 1 million visits every year.

After years of uncertainty and continuing decline, the magnificent gardens surrounding Chiswick House are being restored. Roger Parker Associates are part of the team responsible for the £12.5M project to regenerate the area for the Chiswick House and Gardens Trust.

The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) awarded £7.6 million towards the restoration project, which means that this internationally renowned historic landscape can be enjoyed by future generations.

Work began in spring 2008 on the project that will see the gardens restored, with miles of paths renewed, over 1600 new trees planted, the conservatory brought back to life so that the rare camellia collection can continue to thrive and a new café and lavatories built.
